#### COMPETITORS

The paddock will NOT be marked out in the usual way for this meeting. PLEASE park all vehicles neatly and ensure that access is available for late arrivals, and for the EMERGENCY SERVICES vehicles - it may be YOU that requires assistance! Please DO NOT use the slip road to park or stop on as access is required all through the day.

Competition Licences and BARC Membership Cards will be inspected at signing on. Competitors attention is drawn to Q14.2 regarding the warming of transmissions.

Competition numbers will be available at signing on. Competitors are cordially invited to attend any or all of the Training Sessions to be held in the Barn / Clubhouse.

#### OFFICIALS

Please arrive as early as possible so that training can commence on time. Signing-on, briefing and radio distribution will take place in the Clubhouse, where coffee will be available. There will be a sheet in the Paddock Office for those with duties in the paddock, plus medical and ambulance staff.

Control will call full radio checks as soon as the course is manned; to save time and confusion, please wait for these rather than instigating your own when you arrive on post.

Please observe the one-way traffic system, following the same route as the competitors at all times apart from short-cutting behind the barns if appropriate. To avoid congestion in the paddock, if you come up to the top at lunch-time please park on the grass alongside the braking straight.

At the end of the meeting please stack all your equipment (except radios - deliver to race control) at the trackside; it would be helpful if someone could remain on post until the equipment van arrives, to help load it.

#### COMPETITORS

Motor Homes and caravans must be parked either in the trailer park or adjacent to the fence in the area west of the paddock (access to this area is via the Public Entrance, NOT THROUGH THE PADDOCK); in no circumstances may they be parked on the edge of the hill in the public enclosure.

Paddock vehicle passes are enclosed, as usual, on the basis of one for each competing car, permitting one vehicle <u>or</u> trailer in addition to the competing car to be parked in the paddock during the meeting. This pass must be displayed prominently on the vehicle to which it relates at all times. All other vehicles/trailers should be left in the trailer park. *Please note that, following the re-siting/extension of the paddock, competitors' access to it is now over the cattle grid; the former entrance gate to the east of the toilet block is now an emergency vehicle route.* Any apparently unauthorised vehicle parked in the paddock may be removed by the organisers without notice and by whatever means necessary; if it is found to be connected to a competitor then, reluctantly, the C of C will take disciplinary action against that competitor. Please play fair and set an example to everyone else.

Please note that you must produce at **signing-on** your club membership card as well as your RACMSA competition licence and the entrant's licence if appropriate.

Competition numbers can be purchased at signing-on; you are reminded that driving your car on the public highway displaying these contravenes MSA regulations. You are also reminded that, having had your entry accepted, you are prohibited by MSA regulations from abandoning this event to compete in another.

All cars will undergo scrutineering in their allocated paddock parking bay in batches as outlined in the timetable.

To comply with Health & Safety legislation, the testing of vehicles on the entrance road or any part of the public enclosures is prohibited. Practice starts, tyre warming, excessive braking and/or weaving are all forbidden on the road between the paddock and the startline. Similarly, please bear in mind that the paddock is a non-competitive area and cars must be driven at walking pace when entering and moving about in it. Please give pedestrians due consideration and have regard for their safety.

If you wish, you may take a tender vehicle down to the start with your competition car, in which case please park it on the grass outside the start enclosure and return it to the paddock via the hillside car park road. Please bear in mind that motor vehicles must not be driven on any part of the Harewood Hill premises by anyone who is not licensed and insured to do so; also that the start area is a designated part of the course and, as such, persons under the age of 16 may not enter it.

All competitors must walk the course prior to the start of practice.

#### FINALLY

We hope you have a safe, happy and successful day's motorsport; please help us to help you and everyone else enjoy it too. The BARC Yorkshire committee is constantly striving to improve the facilities and running of events at Harewood; if you have any constructive criticism or suggestions as to how we can achieve this, any of the club officers would welcome hearing from you.

ON POST PLEASE PARK IN THE USUAL PLACES. AT THE END OF THE DAY, PLEASE PARK OFF TRACK AT ORCHARD CORNER, IN THE NEW CAR PARK OR ABOUT 30 YARDS BELOW THE RAMP FOR THE LOWER BARN - NOT ON IT !!

# BARC (YORKSHIRE CENTRE) ANNUAL COMPETITIONS 1997

The series of competitions for some very handsome trophies continues in 1997. These competitions are open to **Yorkshire Centre Members only** who take part in, or organise, or assist at our Centre events. In order to score points within any of the competitions it is essential that you enter on the form below.

The competitions are:-

# THE PEARCE TROPHY

Points are awarded to competitors and marshals on the scale below (and opposite) for all speed events and competitive motoring Club Nights where at least one month's notice has been given. The final markings to decide the awards will be based upon one event less than the total number organised during the season, the lowest points to be discarded.

Each member may gain:-

a) 6 points for acting as Clerk of Course.

b) 5 points for acting as Deputy Clerk of the Course, Secretary of the Meeting or Chief Marshal.

c) 4 points for acting as Assistant Clerk of Course, Assistant Sec of Meeting, Course Controller, Deputy Chief Marshal, Chief Paddock Marshal, Chief Start Area Marshal, Observer or Club Steward,

d) 3 points may be gained for any other marshalling or official position.

Except for Section d) members may only gain additional points in each of the above categories on two occasions during the season. In Section d) points may be gained for every meeting.

# THE PEARCE CONSOLATION AWARD

Awarded to the person placed highest in the Pearce Trophy competition who has not won any other award during the season.

### THE FIRTH BOWL

Awarded to the highest placed lady in the Pearce Trophy Competition.

### THE KEN LEE TROPHY

For competitors only. The award will go to the competitor who gains most points on the same scale as the Pearce Trophy. Should a competitor win the Pearce Trophy, the Ken Lee Trophy will go to the next highest placed competitor.

# THE CHIPPY-IOLA VASE

For couples or father/mother, son/daughter either competing, marshalling or organising together on nominated events on the same basis as the Pearce Trophy. All nominated events count for the award.

At the end of the season a commemorative plaque will be awarded to all member observers and marshals who enter the Annual Competitions and who attend every event during the season.

## MARKING

Points are awarded as below:-

### OFFICIALS & MARSHALS

On two day events, points may be gained by officials and marshals on both days, but officials may gain points in excess of 3 on one day only.

#### COMPETITORS

1st in class (subject to four entries)6 points2nd in class (subject to four entries)5 points3rd in class (subject to four entries)4 pointsAll other starters3 points

If less than four entries in class, points will be based on last in class getting three, next highest four and so on. Points will only be credited in respect of events taking place after the entry form has been received. There will be no retrospective marking. It is however acceptable to hand in the entry form when you come to the start of an event.

Competitors or marshals will only be eligible to win one of the awards in the same year (eg. the winner of the Pearce Trophy cannot also win the Chippy-Iola Vase.)
