Season Passes have been issued and Paddock Vehicle Passes are available to download, please display the Paddock Vehicle Pass prominently to enable you to gain access to the paddock

Entry List - the current entry list is available on our website www.harewoodhill.com

Motorhomes and caravans must only be parked in the trailer park.

Paddock vehicle passes are enclosed (paper entries only, email recipients will arrive separately), permitting one vehicle or trailer to be parked in the paddock during the meeting, in addition to each competing car. This pass must be displayed prominently on the vehicle to which it relates at all times. All other vehicles/trailers should be left on the trailer park. Any unauthorised vehicles parked in the paddock may be removed by the organisers. Please park centrally on your numbered position in the paddock.

Signing-on - you must produce your club membership and/or championship registration cards, as well as your MSA competition licence and entrant's licence if appropriate. If you require an up-grading signature on your licence, it should be left with the Secretary of the Meeting when you sign-on and collected after the results of your class have been published. Competitor support crews who intend to help with starting or tyre cleaning in the start area must sign on and wear the supplied wrist band at all times.

Licences - competitors are reminded of the requirement for a Speed National "A" (open) or Race National "A" licence if their car is a Racing or Sports Libre car, manufactured after 31/12/60 and is over 2000cc (or 1428cc if forced induction), unless the car is currently licenced for use on the public highway and competes in the event in a road legal condition (S7.1.5).

Shared Cars - the order of running of shared cars will be as set out in section 8 of the General Information section of the event Regulations, not as shown in the entry list. Shared drivers should use the driver changeover area.

Scrutineering - all cars will undergo scrutineering in their allocated paddock parking bay. Competitors in "visiting" championships are reminded that they are responsible for ensuring their own compliance with the appropriate championship technical regulations.

Noise - due to local environmental problems, all cars will be checked for noise levels by an MSA Environmental Scrutineer. Both static and trackside checks may be carried out. Any car that does not meet the MSA noise level requirements may be refused permission to run until it is able to comply.

Health & Safety - the testing of vehicles on the entrance road or any part of the public enclosures is prohibited. Competitors are reminded that cars must be provided with a means of starting (S10.3.3). Marshals have been instructed not to push start any cars.

Start Line - Please note that any member of your crew who assist at the start line with tyre cleaning or engine starts, are now required to sign on for each meeting. They may sign on at the Paddock Office or at the start line, they will be given a wrist band which is valid for one day only, it must be worn at all times and be shown to start marshals when requested. The start line is designated a hazardous area and no-one under the age of 16 is allowed to enter.

TYRE WARMING/SPINNING OF WHEELS PRIOR TO THE START LINE IS NOT ALLOWED

Paddock safety - the paddock is a non-competitive area and cars must be driven at walking pace when entering and moving about in it. Please give pedestrians due consideration and have regard for their safety.

No engine shall be run with the gears engaged whilst the vehicle has any driving wheels not in direct contact with the ground, unless all moving parts are adequately guarded and, a competent person is seated in the driving seat...

Because of the restricted nature of the paddock, the riding of paddock bikes (two, three or four wheel, motor or pedal powered) is strictly prohibited. Please note all tarmac roads must be kept clear at all times for access.

Admission – tickets may not be left at the gate. Vehicle passes are not admission tickets.

Drones—The launching or over-flying of drones, or similar machines, on these premises is strictly prohibited"

Waste oil - there is a waste oil receptacle adjacent to the toilet block. Anyone found depositing waste oil anywhere else will be charged with the removal and cleaning.

Course information - there are red lights between Chippy's and Country Corner and also on Quarry Straight which should be treated in the same way as red flags. In areas where corner cutting has taken place there are demarkation posts, which are not penalty markers but which may cause damage to your vehicle if you hit them. Deliberate driving over these markers may be dealt with under C.1.1.5 or C1.1.8.

Leaving the paddock – any competitor wishing to remove their competition car from the paddock during a meeting must notify the \Clerk of the Course. The car may be subject to re-scrutineering on its return. Competing cars or tender vehicles may leave the paddock prior to the end of the meeting under direction from the paddock marshals. No trailers or tow vehicles should be taken in or out of the paddock before the end of the meeting. Please contact the Chief Paddock Marshal if you have any queries about moving your vehicles during the meeting.

WARNING - MOTOR SPORT CAN BE DANGEROUS

OFFICIALS

Please arrive as early as possible so that practice can commence on time. Signing-on, briefing and radio distribution will take place in the Clubhouse. Car passes are not required to allow you through the paddock, please use your marshals pass to gain admittance through the cattle grid. Control will call full radio checks as soon as the course is manned and after lunch please wait for these rather than instigating your own when you arrive on post.

Please observe the one-way traffic system, following the same route as the competitors at all times apart from short-cutting behind the barns if appropriate. To avoid congestion in the paddock, if you come to the top at lunch-time please park on the grass alongside the braking straight. At the end of the meeting please return all the equipment to the Marshals hut. Report any fire extinguisher that has been used to control and leave it track side for collection. Huts should be locked on Sunday nights.
