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YORKSHIRE AUTO TRADER CLASSIC VEHICLE PARADE SUNDAY, AUGUST 9TH 1992

The B.A.R.C. is once again welcoming the special display of Classic Vehicles presented by the Yorkshire Auto Trader and the Yorkshire Thoroughbred Car Club. This is the 9th Annual Event and is now well established at the August meeting.

This year over 150 vehicles spanning 50 years of motoring are assembled to view. The earliest entry to date is a 1927 Austin 7 Chummy which is a familiar sight at this event and owned by Mr. P. A. Watson of Leeds. Also present is a 1935 Austin 7 Ruby owned by Ralph Ashcroft of Leeds and a 1931 Morris Light Van owned by Jonathan Wilby of Pateley Bridge.

Motorbikes are well represented with entries including 1965 BSA B40 owned by Tim Houseman of Ilkley, 1953/57 Tribsa Special owned by Peggy Dengate of Westhoughton, and a 1960 Norton 99 Deluxe owned by Ken Allenge of Thirsk, to name a few.



A BEGINNER'S GUIDE TO HILLCLIMBING

So you've been to Harewood, watched a speed hillclimb, and liked what you saw. The cars, the noise, the smells and the close competition whilst the driving looked a lot of fun. You walked around the paddock and it was open and accessible, everybody was friendly and approachable. There were no fenced off hospitality units guarded by uniformed gorillas, and no large sinister motorhomes from which racing suited prima donas occasionally emerge. This is an amateur sport and there are guys in it who would share their last Rolo with you.

So how do you start competing and what does it cost? There are two aspects, the driver and the car.

Considering the driver first you will need a competition licence (£18 Restricted Speed, £28 National Speed, available from RAC Motor Sports Association, tel. 0753 6817736 for details); motor club membership (£12-£25 according to club size); event entry fee (£33-£45 depending upon status of meeting); a helmet complying with RAC standards (starting at £55); and flame resistant overalls (starting at £55). For around £200 you are in business, and by motor racing standards that is cheap. Borrow a helmet and driving suit for your first event and the figure can be halved.

Choice of car is up to the individual, but supposing you begin at the wheel of your everyday road vehicle preparation can be limited to a timing strut on the front to break the beams, and ignition "on-off" sticker and yellow tape around the battery earth lead. Hardly bankruptcy inducing stuff!

As can therefore be seen, hillclimbing is highly accessible, relatively inexpensive and absolute magic to take part in. Becoming truly competitive may take time, but the main adversary is the clock. Just taking part is reward enough for many competitors, others want to win. Whatever your motivation be it at the helm of a £500 Mini or a £100,000 Pilbeam, you will never regret driving in a hillclimb.





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
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The BARC was founded in 1912 and is Britain's largest motorsport club. We run a dozen national championships at more than 75 meetings during the year for circuit racers, hill-climbers and sprinters.

Our Racing Members can take part in any of our major race championships from Formula Three to Production Saloons (subject to Competition Licence).

Our Marshals' officiate at over 75 meetings – both on and off track – and benefit from the Club's unique Marshals' Stamp Scheme to offset Membership costs or to exchange for insignia and racewear.

Spectating Members benefit from discounts at the Club's headquarters circuit – Thruxton – on admission and privileged stand seats.

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
