

HILLCLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

For the second year running Ken Bailey in the Reynard FF89 finds himself in the lead of the Harewood Championship and like last year, he is under intense pressure from the Cooper 'S' of Michael Holroyd. In '93 Ken saw Michael snatch the championship, and this year history could repeat itself as when low scores come into account Michael has an advantage of over three seconds. Although Ken may be demoted to second place he looks pretty safe to retain this position as his nearest challenger Alan Aucote (Terrapin), who is incidentally leading the FTD section of the championship, is over three seconds in arrears of Ken. In fourth place David Bailey has grown in stature and has hustled the family Reynard to a new class record and his highest position in the championship to date. Fifth place man Paul Greaves (MG Midget) has trod a lonely path in class 4 this year but this has not blunted his competitive edge. Paul could perhaps displace David Bailey but it would probably require an new class record to achieve this.

Alex Tyson missed the May meeting and so will score all the points he gains today. This could shoot him up the leader board into a possible top three position so Alex will have to hope that the weather is kind and the track is in good condition. Peter Hawkey is the third Formula Ford driver in the top ten and presently holds 7th place but this position is under serious threat from Keith Wilford in the Lotus Europa who is another driver to count all his points today. Ninth and tenth place drivers David Sturdy and Glyn Sketchley are not here today, this will open the door for Brent Meredith and Mark Brown, Class 1 drivers in Fiesta and Cooper 'S' respectively. Also just outside the top ten four Formula Ford drivers Stuart Abbott, Colin Wright, Trevor Cooper and Neville Alderson will count all their points today and so could reinforce the Formula Ford presence in the top ten but they will be required to score high points to do so.

FTD SERIES CHAMPIONSHIP

Along with his present third place in the overall championship, Alan Aucote has produced a series of wonderful drives which has taken him to the top of the leader board in the FTD Championship, this is no mean achievement in an 1100cc car. Lola driver John Garnett could perhaps snatch the championship but it will all depend on their final positions at this event. Although John must be favourite to take the championship this is by no means absolutely certain. Absentee John Moulds will slip out of the top three to be replaced by present fourth place man Alex Tyson (who is yet another driver of a small capacity car) or the large single seaters of Alan Newton and Roger Kilty who have scored in three and two rounds respectively.

The championship is balanced on a knife edge and weather conditions could affect the final outcome almost as much as the respective performance of cars and drivers involved. It looks like being an exciting finale.






