marking system

main championship and ladies championship

Marking is within classes, based on the improvement against the bogey time. The 2006 bogey times are the current class record at the start of each meeting with 18 seconds added. Championship marks are gained at the rate of 0.01 points for each 0.01 seconds by which the driver beats the bogey time of his or her class. A maximum of 20 marks can be gained at any meeting.

Any competitor who does not beat the bogey time will gain no marks for that meeting. Marks can only be gained in the two class runs at the 14th May and 1^{st/2rd} July meetings. At the other seven rounds the three timed runs will count, unless a decision to the contrary is made after the first timed run. Marks in six of the nine rounds will count towards the championship result.

fastest time of the day

At each meeting marks will be awarded to the championship competitors who have recorded the ten fastest times of the day in the class runs. Marks will be awarded on the scale of 10 for the fastest competitor down to 1 mark for the tenth.

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
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HAREWOOD SPEED HILLCLIMB COURSE

Harewood has been used as a hillclimb since 1962 when the track started at the lower part of the course just after Chippy's corner (see map). The surface then was tar and chippings. The fastest time set for this short course was over 51 seconds (see records page). Then in mid 1963 the track was upgraded to a tarmacadam surface. In 1992 the track was extended back from Chippy's to the new start, making it the longest permanent hillclimb course on the UK mainland.

So we are back again after a winter break for another exciting season at Harewood!

Today we have the three MG visiting classes. None of the three class record holders are entered, so can someone steal their crown this early in the season?

We have some very strong classes today, especially in the saloon and sports cars. Class 2 has been competitive for the last few years and is still growing in numbers. Surely this class record is ripe for breaking again this year. Another class which is becoming more popular and competitive is the MTA Systems sponsored class 5. For stunning cars just have a look at the Nobel M400 and the TVR Cerbera.

Last year's Ladies Champion has switched classes this year from class1 to class 6, presumably running on slick tyres. If that's the case then it will be interesting to see how Clare adjusts to the extra grip and a bogey time which is now some 4 seconds faster that class 1.

In class 9 we see Andrew Henson in a Formula Ford, rather than his more powerful Pilbeam that took him to second in the fastest time of the day championship last year. Andrew will be pushed hard by younger brother Dean in the same class. Favourite for the fastest time of the day award today must be last year's FTD champion, Jon Waggitt in the 2 litre Reynard Gould F3.




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
