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We were very sad to learn of the death of long-standing member George Tatham. Below John Green shares some memories of George.

George Frederick Tatham

1935-2014

Speedhillclimbing lost one of it's larger than life characters with the recent death of George Tatham.

George's parents were farmers then gold miners in Africa before returning to England for his birth. The family settled in Norton-on-Derwent, then in the East Riding of Yorkshire and purchased Welham Trout Hatcheries.

George went to Bramcote prep school, which he hated, then to Ragley School, which he loved. The staff encouraged his flair for engineering and other practical subjects.

National Service with the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers followed, George was based in Regents Park where amongst other vehicles he looked after was Field Marshall Montgomery's Rolls Royce.

Upon leaving the Army he joined the family business. He met his future wife, Louida, who was an actress then appearing at York Theatre, they married in 1971. They expanded the business to include other fish farms. The business was sold in 1984 and they went arable farming at High Farm. Welham.

George had various sports cars including an Austin Healey and a Lotus 7, but his first taste for competition came with the purchase of an AC Ace Bristol. This was followed by a pre-production Lister Jaguar - the car built for London jeweller Norman Hillwood and later a Lister Chevrolet. His next acquisition was a Brabham BT17 with a 5.3 litre Chevrolet power, a car actually driven by "Black Jack" himself. His last car was the 7.5 litre McLaren M12 fitted with M6 bodywork which was built for Phil Scragg especially for hillclimbing.

George hillclimbed and sprinted these cars during his long competition career taking in local events at Harewood, Catterick, Castle Howard to all the championship hills from Bouley Bay to Doune. His last event was at Shelsley Walsh in late 2013 where George drove his McLaren and at the same meeting his sons Peter and David also competed in Peter's Terrapin.

George's wife Louida was always at these events, helping with the car and looking after things generally from the support vehicle, a single decker bus which George converted into a motorhome/ transporter.

I'm sure that everyone in hillclimbing will wish to offer their condolences to Louida and the family at this time.

With four former Harewood champions (and some complete novices) out on the hill it was clear to see that everybody was taking things seriously and were keen to make each practice run count, there were very few accidents or incidents as drivers blew off the cobwebs and shook down their machinery prior to the new season. It was good to see some of last year's Top Ten runners out on the hill, notably Ben Tranter and Robert Spedding in their new and very smart looking Formula Ford Vector TF93K. 2011 champion Sarah Bosworth was back in action although had to give best on the time sheets to Tracy Taylor West. After many seasons there or thereabouts, could 2014 result in a new Elise class leader and potential champion?

It was also fantastic to see some newcomers not only to Harewood but also to the



sport and it's good to see that the combination of an open stretch of road and a clock are still proving irresistible as Neil Oldham and Craig Peace from Sheffield found as they pooled their resources in a Volvo S60 T5; a quite unlikely choice for an unlimited road going car but these newcomers were putting in some great times and said they would definitely be back to compete later in the season.

After a vagabond 2013 season, 2012 Champion Sarah Bosworth in her Lotus Elise returned to give a champions performance to win her class and stamp her authority on the 2014 Harewood leaderboard after the first round.

On a bright but very cool and breezy day at Stockton Farm, Tracey Taylor West also in a Lotus Elise was in hot pursuit for 2nd in class 2E behind Sarah, securing 2nd in the championship. 3rd place after round 1 was taken by

Dan Hollis driving the Honda Integra R who put in some solid 67s runs in class1B to edge out long-time rival and Harewood curmudgeon James Kerr in his Peugeot 205 GTi. Kerr was distinctly off form, with a couple of trips to the scenery and mechanical gremlins leaving him 4th overall.

Our previously crowned "most promising" driver continues to deliver the goods, getting to grips with his new Formula Ford Vector TF93K and putting in some smooth runs, Ben Tranter lies 5th. Ian Butcher. Renault 5GT. overcame some communication issues in the paddock to consolidate his credentials as a contender in class 1B, 4th in class was good enough to leave him 6th overall. In seventh after the first event we have the hirsute Michael Bellerby in the Sylva Striker, who seems as cheerful as ever. Richard Archbould's Mitsubishi Evo 6, led the way in 1C and is in 8th position overall, Richard may have his work cut out when another former champion, Steve Darley, returns to the hill in his new road-going Subaru at the next event.
